2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

2023 was a year of change and transition. Jane Kilthei, volunteer ED and chair of the board, retired after 12 years with the Centre. During the early years we were a project under the Cowichan Land Trust. In June of 2019 we became a separate non-profit organization. Larry Lenske, treasurer, also retired in 2023. We are thankful for their hard work and dedication.

Alison Adamson, who was hired as Administrative Coordinator at the end of November 2022, was promoted to Office Manager in 2023 due to the heavy workload she had undertaken. A lot of behind the scenes work took place organizing and consolidating computer files from individual computers to a central server.

RESTORATION PROGRAM

Anna Scouten, Restoration Coordinator, with funding from the Pacific Salmon Foundation organized eight restoration events at Fish Gut Alley for Elementary and High Schools Students and the general public. Together 220 people participated – students, teachers and volunteers put in 396 put in 396 volunteer hours to remove 830 pounds of invasive species, mainly English Ivy, from 1150m2 and plant 425 plants over 950m2 including Douglas-fir, Grand fir, Western redcedar, red flowering currant, salal and more.

At the end of this busy and productive year Anna took on a full time position with SD79. We thanked her and wished her well in her new position. We are grateful she continues to be supportive of CENC.
